

The Henry County Fair Association was organized in 1954 and took over an event previously known as the Livestock and Products Show, which had been sponsored by the Paris Chamber of Commerce and the Young Men's

Business Association, Inc. The 1952 booklet describes the show as the "ninth annual," creating a start date of 1943.

The Henry County Fair Association is still going strong and has turned

the local fair into a "Champion of Champions" event recognized by the Tennessee Association of Fairs. It has a big carnival that lights up the night sky in the summer. The sponsors come to show off the latest farm

parking lot is full, but there is something richer and deeper about the Henry County Fair. It is rooted in farm families as well as the local business community.

A perfect example of the heart of the Henry County Fair is the junior livestock auction, which is the largest in Tennessee. Deneicia Gregson, who has served as president, vice president and treasurer of the Fair Board during her years of service, lists the auction as one of her favorite fair events. She says "The kids

> The Henry County Fair brings out a sense of community and devotion that is hard to find at many other events. Businesses and individuals are proud to pay top dollar at the junior livestock auction because it's more than just a purchase, it's a message. It's a way

to reward a young person who has invested his or her time and effort long before stepping forward to show off a prize animal. It shows appreciation for hard work and dedication.

The Fair Association and their **Board of Directors** set an example of hard work for the young people who participate in fair activities. Members of the board contribute approximately 80 hours each during Fair Week. They never stop improving and adding and tweaking. The traditions of county fairs are all there, canning


and sewing, pies and bread and produce, but there's always more.

The photo contest is full of captured moments, from babies to landscapes. Senior citizens are allotted a special time just to eat ice cream and visit. There are musicians and contests and beauty pageants for every age.

A three day livestock show from the 1950s has grown into a week of activities in multiple buildings, but there has always been the support of the University of Tennessee Agriculture Extension



program, which coordinates the local 4-H programs and serves the farmer and rancher and community throughout the year. Local farm families are recognized. There are corn hole tournaments, painting and dancing, along with a pet contest and an opportunity to show off cookie stacking skills. The fair strives to represent the everchanging aspects of farm life in a rural community.

Another event that makes the Henry County Fair special is the country ham curing, which is available to young people who may not have the facilities or resources to raise an animal. Sponsored by Tennessee Valley Ham, better known as

Clifty Farm, it has grown into an opportunity for young people to learn and demonstrate the art and science of curing ham. Clifty sponsors similar contests in Benton County, Tennessee, and near their facility in Kentucky.

Gregson says technology and social media have changed the behind the scenes operations of the fair, but that the biggest change is the last few years has been the development of sponsorship packages, which have "grown so much." Strong support from the business community has always been a trademark of the fair. The foreword in the booklet of the 1950 event describes itself as

"a self-supporting

project" and thanks all the "merchants, business institutions and civic clubs of Paris and Henry County who have been very liberal in their contributions."

see a full building, a community that understands the impact of agriculture on both the bottom line and the values of a small town.

A county fair is a snapshot. It reflects the culture and values of the people who live here. Gregson says the fair is important because it is a way to "share agriculture with the nonagriculture part of our community."






