





The World's Biggest Fish Fry has the distinction of being one of those events that covers every single aspect of what makes a great time in the south. You need good fried food, all

kinds of music and dancing, arts and crafts, a rodeo, a demolition derby, a full-blown carnival, a grand parade and some beauty queens to make it possible. Well the World's Biggest

Fish Fry serves about six tons of fried catfish along with all the fixin's. There is a street dance, a country dance and a Christian concert. You will find an entire building full of arts and crafts to look at and buy. The carnival has almost every ride you can imagine. There's not just one but two parades, a big one and a little one. The IPRA Rodeo is in town and the whole thing gets started with a demolition derby. 

The Iris Festival in Dresden, Tennessee started out as an Easter Parade almost 40 years ago. Now it has






