Ten Tips for Diffues

(NAPS)—According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, there are 5.25 million driving accidents a year in the U.S.—but they needn't happen to you.

What You Can Do

- Don't use your smartphone while driving. Drivers talking on phones, hand-held or hands-free, can miss seeing up to half of their surroundings, such as pedestrians, bicyclists, motorcyclists or other drivers.
- Drive "defensively." Be aware of what drivers around you are doing.
- Keep your eyes moving while you drive. Check all mirrors.
- Leave at least two to four car lengths between your car and the one ahead, six or eight at night or in bad weather.
- Obey all speed limits and signs.
- Never drive under the influence of alcohol or drugs, or if you are fatigued.
- Always wear your seat belt.

- Adjust all mirrors and seats properly before starting the car.
- Use turn signals, and ensure your lights are on at night and in bad weather. Make yourself visible with horn, lights and signals.
- Look out for the truck and bus "No-Zone." Those drivers have big blind spots. If you can't see the drivers in their rearview mirrors, they can't see you.

What Others Are Doing

For example, the 127,000 smallpackage drivers at UPS are among the safest on the roads, logging more than 3 billion miles per year and delivering nearly 5 billion packages annually. In fact, the company recently inducted 1,582 drivers into its elite "Circle of Honor," raising to 10,503 the number of drivers who haven't had a preventable accident for 25 years or

more.

Collectively, these drivers logged 14 billion miles and achieved more than 257,195 years of safe driving throughout their careers. That's enough to circle the equator 547,000 times, or make 206 round-trips to Mars.

DIY Car Care

(Family Features) While taking your car to an auto service professional is a great way to ensure its performance, the Car Care Council reminds vehicle owners there are few simple vehicle checks that they can easily learn and should also be do themselves to save a little money and help keep their vehicles running efficiently all summer long.

With basic knowledge of common maintenance practices and a little

time, motorists can inspect the following components in their own driveway:


- * Check the tires, including tire pressure and tread. Uneven wear indicates a need for wheel alignment. Tires checked for bulges and bald spots.
- * Check all fluids, including engine oil, power steering and brake and transmission, as well as windshield washer fluid and antifreeze/coolant.

* Check the hoses and belts as they can become cracked, brittle, frayed, loose or show signs of excessive wear. These are critical to the proper functioning of the electrical system, air conditioning, power steering and the cooling system.

* Check the wipers and lighting so that you can see and be seen. Check that all interior and exterior lighting is working properly and inspect and replace worn wiper blades. Keep the windshield washer fluid.

- * To keep the cooling system workcoolant and distilled water mixture for a vehicle's radiator should be 50:50. Never open a hot radiator cap coolant level in the reservoir. As a rule of thumb, the coolant should be changed annually on most vehicles.
- * Check the gas cap to ensure it

> * Don't neglect the exterior. When washing the outside, make sure to include the tires and wheels and the underside and

fenders to eliminate and for a free copy any road salt or grime. The body of the vehicle should be washed using a product sold specifically for cars. Wax your vehicle every six months.



TREAD – A tire's tread depth can determine a vehicle's safe stopping distance. You can check your tread depth by sticking a penny upside-down in a tread groove. If you can see President Lincoln's head, it's time to replace your tires.

2 • ENSURE PROPER TIRE PRESSURE – Low tire pressure can lead to poor handling and gas mileage, excessive wear and overloading. Drivers should check their tire pressure at least once a month, and especially before any long trip. Use a dependable air gauge or stop by an automotive store like Discount Tire or America's Tire to take advantage of complimentary air checks.

る。ROTATE **OFTEN** – Tires should be rotated at least every 6,000 miles or earlier if irregular or uneven wear develops. 4. Your Brakes May Be Trying To Tell You Something

(NAPS)—If your brakes are trying to tell you something, you should pay attention. A properly operating brake system helps ensure safe vehicle control and operation and it should be checked immediately if you suspect any problems.

"While an annual brake inspection

is a good way to ensure brake safety, motorists should not ignore signs that their brakes need attention," said Rich White, executive director, Car Care Council. "Knowing the key warning signs that your brakes may need maintenance will go a long way toward keeping you and others safe on the road."

What To Watch Out For

Motorists should look for the following warning signs that their brakes need to be inspected:

- **Noise:** screeching, grinding or clicking noises when applying the brakes.
- Pulling: vehicle

pulls to one side while braking.

- Low Pedal: brake pedal nearly touches the floor before engaging.
- Hard Pedal: you must apply extreme pressure to the pedal before brakes engage.
- **Grabbing:** brakes grab at the slightest touch to the pedal.

• **Vibration:** brake pedal vibrates or pulses, even under normal braking conditions.

• Light: brake light is illuminated on your vehicle's dashboard. Because brakes are a normal wear item on any vehicle, they will eventually need to be replaced. Factors that can affect brake wear include driv-ing habits, operating conditions, vehicle type and the quality of the brake lining material. Be sure to avoid letting brakes get to the metal-tometal point as that can mean expensive rotor or drum replacement.





Here are basics about wheel finishes to keep in mind:

PAINTED: Opting for painted wheels will give you an endless amount of options when it comes to colors and effects, allowing you to personalize your vehicle exactly how you desire. Painted wheels are typically primed before wet paint is applied, and they are finalized with a clear topcoat to protect the paint. To minimize damage or discoloration due to heat or dust brought about by daily use, painted

wheels should be cleaned with a non-acidic and non-abrasive soap that should not be allowed to dry onto the wheel.

POLISHED: Polished wheels are great if you want a wheel with a shiny look or mirror-like finish that is not heavy, which could aid in fuel economy. The wheel is polished to a high luster by buffing it using a machine or by hand before being protected with a high-gloss clear coat. Polished wheels can be cleaned with mild soap and dried with

a microfiber towel, then coated and hand-polished with a non-abrasive wax to help it maintain its luster.

CHROME: If you want the shiniest look possible, opt for a chrome wheel. This popular and classic type of wheel finish is achieved by adding layers of metals, such as copper, nickel and chromium, to create a very reflective finish. You can easily clean chrome wheels with soap and water, then dry them with a soft cloth. To prevent dirt and dust from

sticking to the wheels, add a layer of wax after cleaning them.

POWDER-

COATED: For an extremely durable wheel finish that is resistant to scratches and fading and comes in many color options, go with a powdercoated wheel. To achieve this finish, a wheel is grounded and sprayed with a powder-coat (usually a polyester or epoxy), then exposed to heat (usually in a heating oven), essentially baking on the smooth finish. Like their painted counterparts, powdercoated wheels can be cleaned with a mild soap that should not be allowed to dry on the wheel finish. You can further protect the finish by applying a wheel sealant or coating solution.



Every type of wheel finish provides variations in shine, color and required maintenance, so take the time to research what's available.
