for viewing 5 – 8pm. The Community Building will be open for viewing 9am – 9pm on Thursday, August 25th and noon – 9pm on Friday, August 26th. Check out exhibits on Sunday, August 28th at 12:30pm.

The Henry County Fair is many different things to the people that attend. Some go for the rodeo. Some like the arts and crafts. The livestock auction brings a lot of people to the fairgrounds. But just about everyone wants to attend the carnival! Belle City Amusement is back and bringing everyone's favorite rides, food carts and games!

The carnival will open at 5pm on Wednesday, August 24th, at the Henry County Fairgrounds. Wednesday is also Student Night. Check your children's backpacks for a \$5 coupon sent home from school. Armbands are also available for \$20. The carnival will remain open until 10pm. The Ferris Wheel and Swings are just waiting for you! Make sure and taste test the corn dogs and lemonade and don't let the carnies talk you into playing more games than you can afford. It is kind of cool taking home a huge stuffed animal or goldfish.

The carnival continues at 5pm on Thursday, August 25th, and Friday, August 26th, at the fairgrounds. Both nights will feature unlimited rides

with the purchase of a \$20 armband. The fair will stay open until 10pm on Thursday and until the riders are ready to go home on Friday.

Spend Saturday afternoon at the carnival. The gates open at 1pm. Purchase a \$20 armband and ride unlimited rides until 6pm. The cost will be \$25 until closing late into the night.

For your own personal safety is encouraged that you frequently use hand sanitizer. Masks are not required. But if you are in a high risk group for illness you may want to consider using

Oh how time flies – Henry County will be celebrating its Bicentennial at the Fair this year. There will be demonstrations, exhibits, speakers, games, and rides that will transport you back to the early 1820's when Henry County was just becoming an official county in

Tennessee. You won't want to miss all of these activities beginning at 6pm, Wednesday, August 24th on "Big Ed's Porch" at the Henry County Fairgrounds.

Part of the 1800's experience will be the 1800 style meal served by Miss D, along with

story telling by the master of story tellers Bob Valentine. Jimmy Jackson will be providing wagon rides. You are encouraged to bring your old ag items for showing and sharing.

There will be interpreters on hand demonstrating early farm and family activities. They will be washing clothes, snapping beans and whittling. Families will be playing games

of hopscotch, jacks, dominoes and checkers. There will also be a beard contest to award the longest and the most unique beard.

All celebrations must have dance and music and the Bicentennial Celebration will be no different. Mark Johnson and Danny Conger will play music popular for the time period. The Wade Family of Whitlock will provide buck dancing and clogging to get every one in a

toe tapping happy mood.

There will be local "experts" telling the history of our various villages in Henry County. Allen Ashlock will talk about Davy Crockett, Gary Paschall will discuss Henry history, Caleb Grisson will talk about Whitlock and Bird's Creek History, Cheryl Webb will inform us on Mansfield history, Charlotte Barnes will discuss Henry history, Jeff Morris will talk up

Buchanan history and June Kemp will talk about Cottage Grove history. The evening will end when everyone gathered will bury a Time Capsule to be opened sometime in the future. It will contain items that surely will be unheard of by then. But nonetheless interesting. Make plans to be a part of the Bicentennial Celebration at the Fairgrounds – it's a once in a two hundred year opportunity!

The Future Of Farming Is In Good Hands

A select group of young people look forward to the Henry County Fair every year. Most kids can't wait to get to the carnival. This group of kids can't wait to get to the barn. They have spent their summer vacation raising livestock for the sole purpose

of bringing them to market at the fair. It is a rewarding experience for each young man and woman and can be a financially beneficial one as well.

All participants in the Junior Livestock shows must be enrolled in 4-H or FFA. They must

be a resident of Henry County and enrolled in school in grades 4th thru 12th. Participants must attend all required meetings and fulfill the duties as per instructed in the livestock guidelines.

The Dairy Cattle Junior & Open Show begins at 10am, Saturday, August 20th, at the livestock barn on the Henry County Fairgrounds. Entries are accepted that morning before the show. Limit two entries per breeder. \$5 entry fee per head, per show.

The Junior Market Hog Show will be held at 6pm, Wednesday, August 24th. No entry less than 220 pounds will be accepted or sold. Entries are accepted beginning at 6am that morning. \$30 per entry and the entry must be owned by the youth exhibitor.

The Junior Market Goat Show will be held at 11am, Thursday, August 25th. Minimum weight to show is 60 pounds. Entries will be accepted between 4 – 7pm, Wednesday afternoon. \$30 entry fee per goat. The Junior Market Lamb Show will be held at 10am, Thursday, August 25th. There is a \$30 entrance fee per animal. Entries

are accepted from 4 – 7pm, Wednesday afternoon.

The Junior Market Steer Show will be held at 1pm, Thursday, August 25th. The minimum weight but be 1,050 pounds on the day of show to participate. Entries are \$50 per animal and will be accepted Wednesday afternoon between 4 – 7pm. Steers will be weighed on Thursday morning.

A unique contest to the Henry County Fair is the Woolies Revue. The Woolies Revue will be held at 6pm, Thursday, August 25th. The participant must lead a registered ewe or market lamb and wear garments of wool or wool blend. Prizes are awarded for first, second, third and fourth place in many age categories. The garments do not have to be constructed by the participant nor does the participant have to own the animal. Rehearsal is at the livestock barn beginning at 5:30pm.

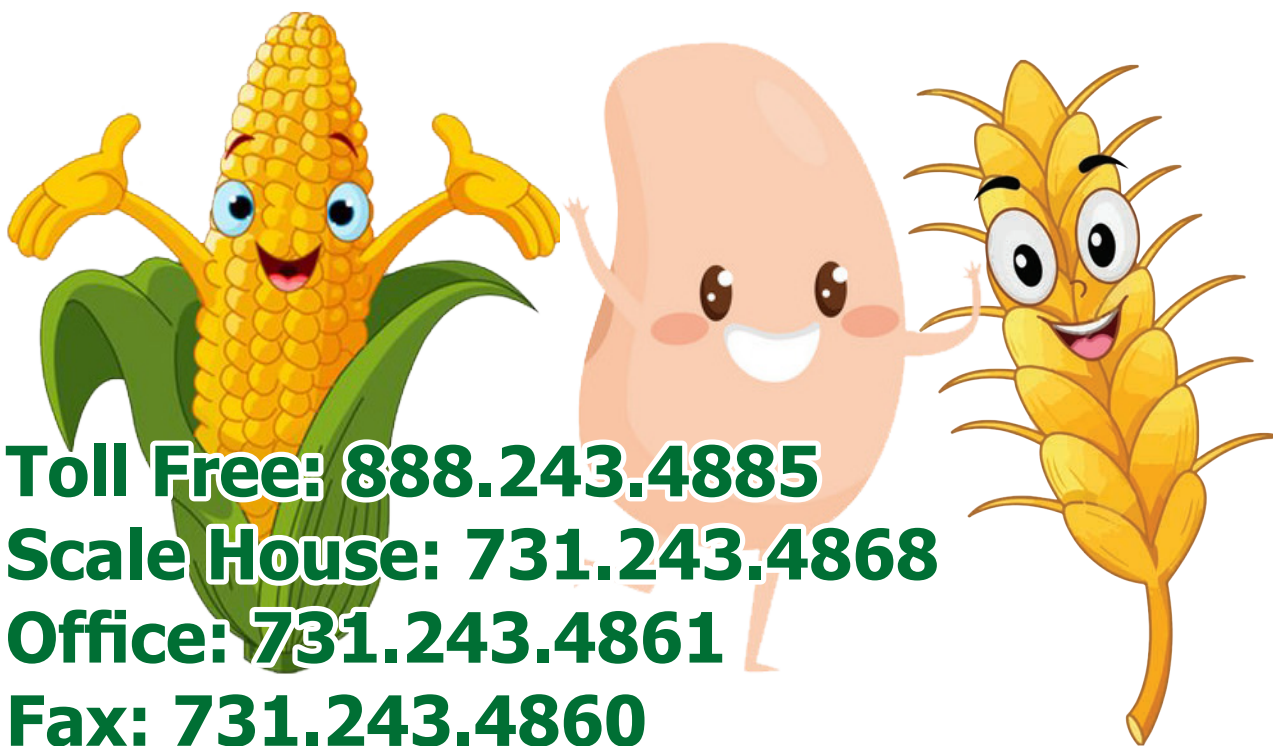
